Earn Volunteer hours:

1. You can **sign up to be an “Admin”** for one or more of the monthly Lunch & Learns (either at the Extension Office on 2nd Wednesday’s, or at the Schertz and/or Seguin Public Library on 2nd Saturday’s).
 - This needs to be coordinated in advance with the Education Director.
 - No experience necessary, we will teach you all you need to know!
 - We are hoping for multiple volunteers for each location so that an “Admin” only needs to cover one event every few months (unless you prefer to be a regular which is fine too!)
 - **At the Extension office tasks include:**
 - Setting up snacks & drinks (stored in MG Office), Setting up sign in sheets, Welcoming guests, Passing out handouts (if applicable), Potentially introducing the Speaker (some Speakers prefer to introduce themselves), Assist Speaker if needed, Collect sign in sheets and return them to the Education Director, Return snacks and drinks to MG Office, Clean-up and restore room to prior setting.
 - **At the Seguin & Schertz Libraries tasks include:**
 - Getting the projector equipment setup (Library Staff Tech Support will help if needed), Setting up sign in sheets, Welcoming guests, Passing out handouts, Libraries handle the snacks & drinks themselves if they even offer them, Potentially introducing the Speaker (some Speakers prefer to introduce themselves), Assist Speaker if needed, Collect sign in sheets and return them to the Education Director, Clean-up and restore room to prior setting, Return projector equipment to the desk.
2. **Seed Exchange** - ~~Every Monday 10:00 AM—12:00 PM, and~~ (**Mondays** hours have been suspended for now due to lack of activity/interest – We will resume when/if the need arises). We continue to be open **Wednesday’s from 2:00 PM - 5:00 PM** (Except for 11/25/2026 & 12/23/2026) - Contact [David](#) or [Karen Koepp](#) or [Ernestine Sykes](#) if you have a special need outside these hours. There is always work to be done here. Below are the current items we would like worked on:
 - We have several boxes of seeds that came back from the 4th of July parade that can be sorted and organized.
 - We have three boxes of new seeds to sort that Clayton brought in to us recently.
 - We have many donated seeds that need sorting, packaging, and labeling.
 - Restock the seed displays as needed.

- Create printable labels for each donated seed type (similar to what we did for the advertising seed packets) - basically a small picture of what the plant or flower will look like, and then the normal details you find on a seed packet.
 - We also still want to create a catalog of all the non-commercial seeds that have been donated by members. This catalog will be similar to what the NPSOT has setup at their seed libraries. Essentially it consists of a data sheet on each seed we have that gives all the pertinent details about that particular seed.
 - We need to get a current full inventory of all the non-commercial seeds we have packaged up.
 - We need to get a general inventory (types & varieties) of all the commercial seeds. We aren't looking to track quantities of the commercial seeds as there is just too much turnover and no easy way to easily track the in & out.
 - We still want to capture all the details on all the books & other print materials in our library so we can get the Research Library contents online so folks can see what all we have available. Get with David Koepp on this as he has the specific app that is used to scan the ISBN #'s and the process of how to catalogue the items.
 - We still want to create relevant documentation on all things seed related. We would like to create our own Guadalupe County Spring & Fall planting guides, Seed saving process and tips, a propagation primer,
 - Review our current Tri-fold brochures and update if necessary and/or add new ones if needed.
 - The Seed Exchange wants your help to produce several GCMG-branded documents, pamphlets, brochures, etc. to use to help advertise what we do here at GCMG and to provide education on our Seed library, Seed saving techniques, Seed starting, Varieties that do well here, Planting times, propagation primer, our own Spring & Fall Planting guides, Types of seeds explained (open pollinated, heirloom, hybrid, F1, organic, GMO, etc. and other materials that are helpful. If you like to write and are interested in producing one of more of these types of materials for us, please contact [David Koepp](#) for more information.
 - The MG Office is also looking for some help from members who are creative and would like to create some GCMG-branded cards for the various occasions that we send cards out for including: Thank You cards, Get Well, Sympathy, etc. Please contact [David Koepp](#) for more information. I have since created several cards to use, but we welcome other ideas and content. We have computers that can be utilized for these purposes in the office, or you are welcome to bring your own or in some cases work on them at home remotely.

 11. **Our remaining 2026 interns still need many volunteer hours by the end of June 2027 in order to certify** and may welcome a friendly offer of mentorship to help them achieve that goal. **You can find the intern list in VMS** by going to the General Information tab then Member Roster, then toggle the “Status” twisty (triangle next to “Status” if not already showing list) on the far left and click on Interns. You can further filter by typing the “Start year” of Interns you want to see (2026) in the quick search box and pressing enter.
